The Certificate IV in Government – Investigations PRS41504 and **Certificate IV in Government - Fraud Control PRS40604** are gazetted educational qualification requirement of the Federal Government under the Public Service Training guidelines to be met by ALL persons who are involved in any investigation process. This includes, fraud managers, internal investigators, section heads, field agents, investigation officers who vet investigation related reports, and so on. These two courses replace the single previous course Certificate IV in Government - Fraud Control (Investigations) PRS40499.
